Welcome to the New Sharon Public Library at 1 School Street!

Our construction company continues to work through the remaining items on their punchlist, and we appreciate everyone's patience as contractors work to finish up outstanding building issues.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us to keep the building clean and to ensure a welcoming and safe environment for all who visit the Library.

Parking

Parking is available on site and in the municipal lot on High Street. <u>Library users may not park on School Street</u>. When parking in the Library's lot, please use caution when entering and exiting.

<u>EV charging spaces</u> in the Library's lot are designated for vehicles that are **actively charging**; they are not for general EV vehicle parking. All questions regarding the charging stations must be directed to the Town's Department of

Public Works; they are not managed by the Library.

Patron Behavior

Children in Grade 4 and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times. For safety, please do not leave your children unattended in any part of the building.

Food is not allowed anywhere in the building; this includes snacks and candy. The exception is for programs in the Community Room where permission has been granted by the Director.

Covered drinks are permitted in all spaces except the computer stations and the Carpeno History Room.

Footwear must be worn at all times in the Library.

Study Rooms

Study Rooms may be reserved for up to two hours per day, per person/group. Room use limitations are in place to enable all patrons to have access. The Study Room Use Policy is posted in each study rooms.

Meeting Rooms

The Business Pod and Cheyer ESOL Room are reserved for groups to work collaboratively; they are not additional study rooms. Please do not ask staff to let you in these rooms unless you have an approved reservation. The Meeting Room Use Policy is posted in both rooms.


"Captain Kidd: A True Story of Treasure and Betrayal" with Author Samuel Marquis

Out of the Archives

Welcome to The Carpeno History Room By Arielle Nathanson

Sharon residents have always been interested in our local history. But now, with a new archive and research room, that history is more accessible than ever. The Carpeno History room was named for Mr. Philip A. Carpeno, a lifelong Sharon resident. He was a veteran and highly valued individual in our community, and we are proud to have an archive bearing his name.

Currently, usage of the reading room and historical materials is by appointment only. Please reach out to our Archivist at: anathanson@sharon.ocln.org. Be sure to include information about what you are interested in viewing. Some questions to think about are:

- 1. What is your research project? What are you hoping to be able to do with the information you find?
- 2. What physical items are you looking for? Photographs? Diaries? Deeds? Reports?

Viewing a finding aid can be helpful in judging if our collection will be of interest to you. A finding aid lists all the materials an archive has to offer, as well as providing some historical context. The following is a **truncated version**. The full finding aid can be accessed by reaching out to the Archivist.

After making an appointment, all patrons must fill out our **Archival Registration**Form that is available on our website, and then sign our logbook upon arrival. The registration form is valid for one year, and needs to be completed only once. The logbook should be signed at the start of each visit to the archive.
