# Online Spotlight / Newsbank



Did you know that OCLN patrons have access to online collections of local and national newspapers? NewsBank consolidates current and archived information from thousands of newspaper titles, as well as newswires, web editions, blogs, videos, broadcast transcripts, business journals, periodicals, government documents and other publications (1980s to present).

NewsBank includes America's News, Black Life in America and Heritage Hub. Access is available remotely 24/7 on any device.



Explore and stay informed about local and national topics, people and events in areas such as business, health, education, jobs and careers, political and social issues and more. Features a wide variety of credible, vetted news sources spanning the U.S. America's News also includes the Patriot Ledger, Brockton Enterprise, Boston metro papers, and archived issues of the Sharon Advocate and Times Advocate (through 5/4/2022).

#### Features of America's News

- Email, print and download articles
- Create an account to save searches and articles in personal folders
- Set up an alert to receive the latest news on a topic or search delivered to your email inbox
