#### **Understanding "Suspend Hold" in Libby**

We've had several questions recently about Libby's "Suspend Hold" feature, especially from readers who see that they're first in line for a title but still don't have access.

Here's what's happening:

- **Suspend Hold** lets you keep your place in line for a title without having it checked out to you right away.
- This is useful if you're busy reading something else or won't have time to start your next book just yet.
- While your hold is suspended, Libby skips over you temporarily when a copy becomes available, but you keep moving up the waitlist.
- Once your suspension ends, or you manually "unsuspend" the hold, Libby will offer the title to you the next time it's available.

If Libby says you're first in line but you still don't see the title, it's likely your hold is still suspended. You can fix this by opening your **Holds** list, tapping **Manage Hold**, and selecting "**Unsuspend Hold**."



## Using Microsoft Accounts Safely on Public Computers

We've noticed some patrons signing into their personal Microsoft accounts directly on our public computers. While this might seem convenient, it can cause problems as your personal settings, files,

and even saved passwords can be synced to our public computers. The Library's privacy software cannot prevent this.

To protect your privacy:

- Do not sign in to Windows or the Microsoft Store with your personal Microsoft account.
- Instead, access your files through OneDrive in a web browser.
  - 1. Open any browser (like Edge or Chrome).
  - 2. Go to onedrive.live.com.
  - 3. Sign in and work with your files online.

When you're done, be sure to sign out of your account and close all browser windows before leaving the computer.

This method keeps your information private and ensures nothing personal is left behind on a shared computer.

#### 3 Dimensional Embroidery Workshop

In this workshop, you'll learn the art of **Brazilian Embroidery**, a beautiful three-dimensional technique that uses highly twisted rayon thread from Brazil to create delicate, raised floral designs. By wrapping, casting on, and looping threads, you'll bring petals to life as they stand up from the fabric surface.

Esther Begleiter has been teaching embroidery since the late 1970s and is the founder and past president of the Suffolk County Chapter of the Embroiderers' Guild of America. Her expertise spans a variety of embroidery styles including Blackwork, Crewel, Hardanger, Canvas (Needlepoint), Pulled Thread, and Smocking. All designs taught are her own original, copyrighted works.

## Christmas with the Mann Family by Arielle Nathanson

Despite being a beloved national holiday, Christmas wasn't officially recognized as such until 1870. The Puritans, who disliked anything with foreign roots, kept Boston Christmas-free under a penalty of five shillings (47 cents).

It wasn't until the literary figures of the early 1900s, like Washington Irving and Charles Dickens, wrote their Christmas tales, that the American public started to associate the holiday with charity, goodwill and family. This shift can be seen in the Mann Diaries housed in The Carpeno History Room.
